Our children are precious, please do not put them at risk




Congratulations



In the dragon's eye I see, Bloodshot eyes flickering, Waving in the night, Scarlett eyes shimmering, Telling me wrong from right.


Boiling and seething, A swirling glow, The pit of death, Staring in my soul.

- A session delivered by specialists from Gateshead College who educated the children in sports psychology.
- Cooking4Life where Chef Nick shared his mission to teach children how to cook healthy food and
 educated them on the different food groups, and how essential each one was to ensure that their
 bodies give them the best performance.

The children thoroughly enjoyed the various tasks and challenges throughout the day and were encouraged at every workshop to consider how what they learnt could be applied to their chosen sport, and how this would help them as athletes.
