Torah Scrolls

We talked about what a torah is. A torah scroll is a piece of writing that is rolled up. It is kept in a cupboard called an ark. They use a pointy finger called a yad to read it because they don't want to have greasy fingers on them. It is split into five sections and is very special.

Ark

The ark is a cupboard that you keep the torah in. At Newcastle reform they had a curtain with a picture of a menorah on it.

Kippah

A kippah is a special hat that men wear and women who have been married.

Menorah

The menorah is a special candle holder with seven candles on it with the middle one bigger. The middle one is also ment to keep burning.

Parchment

A parchment is something you put in a mezuzah and you put a mezuzah on your door to show you are a Jewish person. It has writing on it and the writing on it is Hebrew.

Seder Meal

The seder meal is a meal they have at Passover once a year. In it there are lots of foods like a boiled egg, shark bone, a bitter herb, parsley, lettuce, charoset and salty water which they dip the lettuce in.







Appointments during school time


If your child has an appointment at hospital or with any other outside agency, please bring your letter to the school office where a photocopy will be taken for our records.





