


The Great Spotacular was a HUGE success at Emmaville this year and we raised over £1,500 for Children in Need!

Hello everyone. I would like to share some more information with you from a course that I recently attended linked to Online Safety.

The key message for parents helping to keep their children safe when using the internet was 'Be Nosy!' Treat the 'online' world as you would the 'offline' world. Have lots of conversations with your children about who they are talking to online just as you would ask them who they were meeting in the real world.

Hopefully, you were able to create a family agreement from the information we shared with you in September's newsletter. This was linked to the Childnet site. I would like to signpost you to another fantastic resource which will give you guidance and support as you and your children negotiate the online world. The site is https://www.internetmatters.org/ When you go onto the site it will give you lots of internet safety advice. If you click the link it will take you directly to a part of the site that will help you to create a family toolkit that will be tailored to your individual family needs to support you when you and your children are using the internet.
