Payment

Our External Music Teachers will let you know their own terms. Payment might be expected in advance for a whole school term, for example. Payments will be made by parents **directly to the music teacher.**

Please note: No refunds will be made for any children who wish to 'drop out' of a session during a term or half term. We expect parents to explain to their children that they have made a commitment to other children, parents and teachers to stick with the lessons for the full term or half term, depending on what has been agreed with your child's teacher. We expect all those who have booked to attend **all** of the sessions and complete the course. Learning how to play a musical instrument doesn't 'just happen'. To make progress, children need to put in time and effort. One of the benefits of learning a musical instrument is that children can see and hear the results of their own efforts.

Please let the music teacher know as soon as possible if your child does not wish to continue with lessons into the next term or half term. This allows teachers time to contact and receive payment from anyone on the waiting list who may wish to take the place.

If for any reason your child is unable to attend their lesson, including **illness, school outings, changes to Breakfast and After School arrangements and school training days**, please let the music teacher know by leaving a telephone message directly with them. Our school office will not be passing on messages.

Children are able to go home at the end of the school day and return to school for their lesson. If they need to attend Breakfast or After School Club this will be charged at the normal rate. Before and After School Music lessons will not include food and drink, only music tuition.

Musical Instruments

School has purchased some stringed instruments which we can rent out to parents who do not wish to buy their own for their child at this stage. It costs £20 to hire one instrument. £10 will be returned to you once an undamaged instrument is returned. There is no additional charge for each year of hire.

Piano Lessons: Children will use the electric piano in school.

Drums: Children will use a drum kit and/or drum pads in school. Ear defenders, for use in school, will be made available and cleaned between use. It is worth your child having their own set of drum sticks so that they can practice at home.

Booking Lessons

Lessons are open to anyone in Year 1 to Year 6. Please contact the relevant music teacher **as soon as possible** to register your interest.

Parents of children currently in Reception, may contact our music teachers while their child is still in Reception Class. This will enable their child to start lessons in the September of being in Year 1.

The musicians may be teaching at the time of your call, so please leave a message if you get no answer. Once the timetable is full, music teachers will compile a waiting list and let you know if a place becomes available for the next half term.

Communication and Organisation

Please note, our school office will not be involved in the organisation of these sessions and staff will not be available to collect, supervise or drop off children to the lessons.

- The **Main School Reception** door - if the lesson takes place in the **Staff Room**, **Meeting Room** or **Sensory Room**.
- **South America Classroom's** outside door near the **Dance Studio** - if the lesson takes place in the Dance Studio.
- The lessons will start promptly.
