As historians and geographers, we will:

- Develop an awareness of the past by comparing present day London to London in 1666
- Identify similarities and differences between ways of life in different periods
- Know and understand key features of the Great Fire of London including where and how it started
- To understand how we know about the past and evaluate the effectiveness of a range of sources
- Use a timeline to order significant events that happened over the period of the fire
- Ask and answer questions to show they understand key features about the great fire
- Learn about the significance of key individuals during this time including Samuel Pepys
- Create models of houses from 1666, understanding how this style contributed to the start of the fire

As musicians and performers, we will

- Use voices expressively and creatively by singing songs and speaking chants and rhymes
- Explore using and changing dynamics and pitch
- To play tuned and un-tuned instruments
- Learn songs and actions for our Christmas performance.
- Listen to music from a range of genres with a different focus each week

As computer users, we will

- Learn how to use technology safely and develop the idea of e-safety
- Use simple coding programmes (Kodable)
- Input code in a sequence, using loops and conditionals to create a desired outcome
