

All of the Year One staff involved with the play were absolutely 'blown away' by how brilliant our children were.



Thank you so much to all of the people that gave up their time to come in and show us what their jobs entail.



Nursery and Reception also designed and made some delicious bakes to market to each other. On Friday afternoon, children from both Nursery and Reception sold their products to each other for snack.

The children then developed their team work skills further in the afternoon as the new task was to build a product out of Lego and present a Dragons Den style pitch for their product.


We were all blown away by the determination, imagination and team work shown by all the children. Well done Year 4!





Last week, we were lucky enough to have author Eleanor Baggaley come into school to deliver Emmaville a copy of a book titled "Look at Me". "Look at Me" has been part of a 5-year project to promote inclusion and raise awareness of Down's Syndrome in the North East community.

The book has been created by the charity Down's Syndrome North East.

All of the friends in the book volunteered to have their photos taken and were then asked to think about what was important to them and how they would like to be seen as individuals. The friends of the book explained how they would like readers to understand that people who have Down's Syndrome share the same range of emotions, dreams and interests as everyone else.

Our Year 4 school councilors Millie, Riley, Thomas and Millie were presented with the book by Ava (Reception class) and her mum Eleanor. The children spent time talking with Eleanor about the book and also about the work done by the charity Down's Syndrome North East.
