To help us to increase our children's experience of music, the whole school focuses on a different genre each week. Please tell the children the name of the genre of music for the week and play one example, or more, every day. You might like to play the music as the children leave or return to the classroom. (Eg: at break, lunch times or at the start or end of the day.)



There are many, many types or genres of music. They can be classified by country of origin, a time in history and musical features.

Western Classical Music tends to be grouped according to a time in history.



During that time music was, of course, being played across the world. Each country has its history of its own local music.

Due to the movement of people to different parts of the world, musical styles have been combined over time creating interlinked styles of music.

We have tried to group the genres of music to show some progression of the development of styles. We have included styles and genres to support the learning of key celebrations and traditions. We have chosen some genres which clearly demonstrate a musical feature.

The aim is to provide the children with access to a broad variety of musical styles, to develop recognition of features and instruments heard in the music and to learn musical vocabulary relating to these.
