WORKING IN PARTNERSHIP WITH PARENTS

Dear Parents/Carers,

I hope that you all had a relaxing half-term break. It is disappointing to know that we are about to enter another national lockdown, but with the rise in the infection rate it was only to be expected. Hopefully, this lockdown will last no longer than the planned month.

Although the country will go into lockdown, I am pleased that schools will remain open as I feel that the children need some form of normality. However, we will continue to ensure that all risk assessments are adhered to so that we can protect both the school and the local community.

There may be occasions when the children or staff must self-isolate. If this does happen then it is extremely important that the school is immediately notified. Whilst self-isolating, if children are well, then the expectation would be that they follow the weekly timetable that is posted on their class page; the class page can be found on the school website. Any queries in respect of suggested learning activities should be addressed with class teachers using the Seesaw App. If a member of staff needs to self-isolate, then I have no option but to employ a supply teacher to cover the class during the teacher's absence. Fingers crossed; this will not happen very often, but we must be prepared for all eventualities.

Free School Meal Entitlement

Please be aware, if your child/children are eligible for free school meals and they must self-isolate, then we can provide a packed lunch that can be collected from the school. However, you must let the school office know if you require a packed lunch/lunches.

Enrichment Activities

As a result of the pandemic, we are unfortunately restricted in what we can offer the children in the way of enrichment activities. We are, however, trying to be creative in our thinking so we can bring some 'colour' to the curriculum. For example, author workshops organised by Seven Stories, participation in the national book festival, the children will have the opportunity to participate in the national Children in Need charitable event, there will be a Christmas lunch/festive jumper day and they will get to see a Pantomime streamed from a London venue. Rest assured more activities will be added to the list.

Charitable Activities

Many thanks to you all for supporting the CLIC Sargent fund raising event. The non-uniform/Halloween activity helped us to raise £465. This contribution has been added to the Riley family's just giving page, and they have so far raised £2911. That is a remarkable achievement, and Linzi Hanvey is extremely grateful for the support that you have given to their family's fundraising activities.

Generally, at this time of year we would be selling poppies to the children. Sadly, this year we have decided that under the circumstances this was not a good idea. However, as poppies are yet another reminder of how fortunate we are to have the life that we have due to so many brave people who fought in horrific wars, we have made a £100 donation on behalf of the school to the Poppy Appeal.

Last Christmas, we asked that no presents were given to the staff. Although we appreciate your generosity, we felt that a donation to local food banks was the best gift that you could give to us. Your response to that request was tremendous. We are very aware that the People's Kitchen does some remarkable work. Mr Elliott is a great supporter of their work and is a regular volunteer at the People's Kitchen. This Christmas we also ask that no presents are given to the staff, instead we wish to support the People's Kitchen and we hope to set up a just giving page as we can currently not accept food donations. Once the page is set up, anyone who would wish to make a monetary donation can do so.

Value/Belief of the Month


Compassion – to have compassion means to empathise with those who are suffering and to help in some way to reduce the suffering.


